

JANUARY SESSION, A. D. 19 70

AN ACT

IN AMENDMENT OF TITLE 11, CHAPTER 44 OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF RHODE ISLAND, 1956.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Title 11, Chapter 44 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, is hereby amended to include the following section:

"11-44-24. Trespass to Public Buildings.

Every person who shall enter a public building and wilfully remain there after regular business hours and who is requested to leave by the person in charge of said building or any police officer shall be imprisoned not exceeding one (1) year, or be fined not exceeding FIVE HUNDRED (\$500) DOLLARS."

SEC. 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage and all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
