CHAPTER 699

No. 95 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 666 BY APPROPRIATING
THE SUM OF THIRTY FIVE THOUSAND (\$35,000) DOLLARS TO THE TRAFFIC
ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT, ITEM 6.

Approved February 6, 1953

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1: Chapter 666 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence as approved September 22, 1952, and entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$28,328,060.70 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1953", as amended, is hereby further amended by appropriating the sum of Thirty Five Thousand (\$35,000) Dollars to TRAFFIC ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT, ITEM 6, for off-street parking purposes.

SECTION 2: The said sum of Thirty Five Thousand (\$35,000) Dollars as thus added and appropriated shall be obtained by authorizing and directing the City Controller and City Treasurer to transfer a like amount from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account to the Receipt Account.

SECTION 3: The Estimated Receipts from Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures is hereby increased by Thirty Five Thousand (\$35,000) Dollars.

SECTION 4: The said sum of Thirty Five Thousand (\$35,000) Dollars as herein appropriated or such portion thereof as may be expended shall be repaid to the General Fund from the proceeds of notes or bonds for off-street parking purposes.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

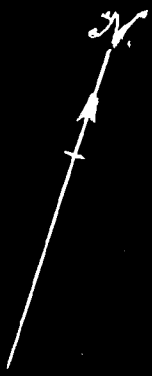

AN ACT

TO AMEND AN ACT TO REPEAL CHAPTER 73 OF THE
GENERAL LAWS, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO REPEAL
CHAPTER 73 OF THE GENERAL LAWS."

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 73 of the General Laws,
entitled "Repealing of Highways and Bridges by Cities and
Towns" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following
sections:

"SEC. 13. Whenever notice or hearing is
required before a town or city council
shall order the establishing, dedicating
or abandoning of a public street or high-
way, the establishing, defining, changing the grade
of, or bringing to grade a street or highway, the
establishing or extending of sidewalks or the con-
structing of sewers thereon, whether such notice
or hearing is required by this Chapter or by
Chapter 73 of these General Laws, or by any
other general or special law, the notice may be
given and/or the hearing may be held by such
Committee of the city or town council as said
body may refer the matter to for consideration.

"SEC. 14. After a hearing has been so held, the Com-
mittee shall make its report and recommendation
to the city or town council prior to passage of
any affirmative order by said town or city
council."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
passage, and all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith
are hereby repealed.
