ORDINANCES SECOND READING

**The following Ordinance was in City Coun-
cil July 15, 1994, Read and Passed, the
First Time and is Returned for Passage,
the Second Time:**

An Ordinance Providing for the Assessment
and Collection of 1994 Taxes in a sum not less
than One Hundred Fifty Nine Million Eight
Hundred Fifty Eight Thousand Nine Hundred
Dollars (\$159,858,900) and not more than One
Hundred Seventy Eight Million Five Hundred
Sixty Five Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars
(\$178,565,800) being based on One Hundred
Percent (100%) of the 1994-1995 Fiscal Year Tax
Collections.

Be it Ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of
Providence, hereby orders the assessment and
collection of a tax on the ratable real estate and
tangible personal property, as well as orders the
assessment and collection of an excise tax on all
registered motor vehicles, in a sum not less than
One Hundred Fifty Nine Million Eight Hundred
Fifty Eight Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars
(\$159,858,900) and not more than One Hundred
Seventy Eight Million Five Hundred Sixty Five
Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$178,565,800)
being based on One Hundred Percent (100%) of

the 1994-1995 fiscal year tax collection, as amended; said tax is for ordinary expense charges and for the payment of interest and indebtedness in whole or in part of said City and for other purposes authorized by law.

Section 2. The City Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on inhabitants and ratable real estate and tangible personal property of said City as of the 31st day of December A.D. 1993 midnight, Eastern Standard Time, as well as assess and apportion said excise tax on owners of registered motor vehicles in the City of Providence during the calendar year 1993, according to law, and shall on completion of said assessment, date and sign same, and shall make out and certify to the City Collector of the City of Providence, on or before the 15th day of June, A.D. 1994 a complete listing containing (1) the names of persons taxed and the total value of all real estate taxed to each; (2) the amount of personal estate except manufacturers' machinery and equipment assessed against each person; and (3) the amount of said motor vehicle excise assessment against each person, on said real estate, personal estate and motor vehicle opposite the name of the person or persons assessed.

The assessment of real estate, personal estate, and motor vehicles shall appear on separate lists.

Said taxes shall be due and payable on and between the 1st day of July, A.D. 1994, next and the twenty-fifth day of July, A.D. 1994, next and all taxes remaining unpaid said last named day shall carry until collected a penalty at the rate of twelve per centum (12%) per annum upon such unpaid real estate, personal estate and excise taxes.

Said taxes may be paid in four installments, the first installment of twenty-five per centum (25%) on or before the twenty-fifth day of July, A.D. 1994 next and the remaining installments as follows:

Twenty-five per centum (25%) on the twenty-fourth day of October A.D. 1994,

Twenty-five per centum (25%) on the twenty-fourth day of January A.D. 1995,

Twenty-five per centum (25%) on the twenty-fourth day of April A.D. 1995,

Each installment period successfully and in order shall be free from any charges for interest. Provided, however, the option to pay taxes in quarterly installments shall not apply to any tax levied in an amount not in excess of \$50.00. If the first installment or any succeeding installment of taxes is not paid by the last day of the respective installment period or periods as they occur, then the whole tax or remaining unpaid balance of the tax, as the case may be, shall immediately become due and payable and shall carry, until collected, a penalty at the rate of twelve per centum (12%) per annum on said real estate, personal estate and excise taxes.

The City Collector shall by advertisement in a public newspaper of the City notify all persons assessed to pay their respective taxes at his/her office on and between the 1st day and twenty-fourth day of July, A.D. 1994, both days inclusive; said Collector shall attend daily during said periods, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays excepted, at his office from eight-thirty o'clock a.m. to four o'clock p.m. to receive taxes.

Section 3. This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to Rhode Island General laws 44-5-2 (c).

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

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Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By the City of Providence:

Section 1. To defray the expenses of the City of Providence for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, the sums of money or so much thereof, as are authorized by law, indicated in the accompanying schedule, are hereby appropriated for the objects and purposes, and in amounts expressed therein provided that payments thereunder shall be subject to the provisions of the Home Rule Charter of 1980, validated by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island at its January Session, A.D., 1981 and approved November 4, 1980, and subject to the provisions of the City Ordinances relative to the expenditures of money from the City Treasury. Fiscal Assistance to State and Local Government rules and regulations shall govern the portion of this Budget so designated.

Section 2. The payments to the School Fund of the following estimated receipts included in the

appropriation of 158,760,049 for the support of the Public Schools for the City of Providence fiscal period 1994-1995, will be increased or decreased to conform with the actual amounts received from such sources during the City of Providence fiscal year 1994-1995.

Section 3. Any transfer to the General Fund from Expendable Trust Funds shall be restricted to and deemed to be utilized for the payment of debt obligations of the City of Providence.

Section 4. Notwithstanding the provision of Section 17-185 of the Code of Ordinances, the amount of Eight Million, Nine Hundred Eighty-Two Thousand, Two Hundred Fifty-Seven Dollars (\$8,982,257.00) is hereby appropriated to the Pension Accumulation Fund.

Section 5. The pension deferral incorporated in this budget shall be paid back in no more than five years. The pension deferral incorporated in this budget is in anticipation of increased aid to education resulting from court action in the case of the *City of Pawtucket, et al, versus Bruce G. Sundlun et al* or action by the Rhode Island General Assembly on what has been become known as Guaranteed Student Entitlement. Guaranteed Student Entitlement proposals that have been discussed consist of an education component. Any funds received by the City of Providence under the tax relief component shall be pledged immediately to the repayment of this deferral.

Section 6. *Whereas*, The Supreme Court of Rhode Island has rules that the governing body of a municipality may limit the authority of its negotiators with respect to collective bargaining agreements with labor organizations, and

Whereas, The Superior Court has held that the Providence City Council may lawfully limit the authority of the Mayor of the City of Providence by issuing instructions with respect to labor negotiations, and

Whereas, The cost of Employee benefits has a direct and significant impact on the finances of the City of Providence, and

Whereas, The Providence City Council has issued such instructions to the Mayor in the past in furtherance of its appropriation authority,

Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained,

That neither the Mayor nor any other individual acting as negotiating agent on behalf of the City of Providence shall have the authority to negotiate a collective bargaining agreement on behalf of the City of Providence with any labor organization unless such agreement includes all of the following:

1. Elimination of health benefits for life for new employees;
2. New Employees shall be required to make a contribution or co-payment for their health insurance coverage;
3. The term of the contract shall not exceed one year;
4. Lay offs shall not be prohibited;
5. Wage increases should not exceed 5% percent;

Any collective bargaining agreement entered into on or after the date hereof shall not be effective, binding upon or enforceable against the City of Providence, unless the agreement incorporates the provisions required hereunder.

The limitations contained herein shall remain in effect and until this Ordinance is modified, repealed or suspended.

Section 7. The provisions included in this Ordinance supersede any prior Ordinances or any provisions thereof.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

Section 1. The aforescribed Compensation Plan is hereby adopted for all City Officers and employees and shall be applied to each, except as hereinafter described.

In order to provide for periodic increases, each position is categorized as one (1) of thirty-five (35)

"Pay Grades", each of which contains five (5) steps.

Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, any and all employees in the Office of the Mayor shall be excepted from any salary established herein so long as the total of the compensation for such employees does not exceed the annual budget appropriation for personnel services in the Office of the Mayor.

Section 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, the compensation for positions approved by the Salary Review Board and legal assistants to the City Solicitor shall be no greater than those herein specified; however, any department head or legal assistant to the City Solicitor may be compensated at a rate lower than that established herein, and that lower compensation shall be allowed by this Ordinance. For all positions with salary range provisions, the actual compensation shall be as listed in the personnel supplement.

Section 4. No member of a collective bargaining union shall receive an increase in compensation above the negotiated wage settlement unless the Union agrees in writing that the wage increase will not result in grievances or effect any other position.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect July 1, 1994.

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Sec. 60. The number of employees in the Office of the Mayor shall not be limited. The Mayor may appoint without reference to civil service provisions and without the necessity for approval by the City Council a Chief of Staff and such Deputies, Assistants, Aides, Secretaries, Stenographers, Clerks and other personnel as he may deem necessary.

Sec. 61. No person shall be appointed to, and the City Treasurer shall not pay, nor shall an officer or employee of the City issue a check for the payment of, nor pay any salary or compensation to a person holding or claiming to hold a position in the classified service in any department which is in excess of the total number of positions or the number of any individual class of positions provided herein for the particular department, provided; however, that with the approval of the department head and the Director of Finance, said maximum may be exceeded

temporarily when regular employees are absent on vacation and the excess employees do not aggregate more than the number on vacation or during the absence of employees due to injuries received while discharging their duties as employees, or during absences of employees on sick leave and it is necessary to employ temporary employees for the duration of the employees sick leave, or during the absence of employees who have been granted a temporary leave of absence, or when in the opinion of the Director of Finance, a temporary emergency exists.

Sec. 62. Where no maximum limit is fixed on the total number of positions or the number of any individual class of position in a department, the number of persons appointed and employees shall be determined by the unexpended appropriation available.

Sec. 63. Chapter 1993-24 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence approved July 30, 1993, with all amendments and additions thereto, is hereby repealed and all other Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith, are likewise repealed.

Sec. 64. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

COUNCILWOMAN NOLAN requests the privilege of the Floor to Speak on a Point of Personal Privilege and states:

"Discrimination is an ugly word. Unfortunately we find it too often in our society, whether it is race discrimination, gender discrimination, reverse discrimination, discrimination against our homosexual population — whatever, it is alive and well in Providence, Rhode Island.

One lesser form of discrimination that we hear about these days, especially on talk radio, is

discrimination against — you guessed it — politicians. Politicians are just all no good and former politicians are even worse. Everything politicians do is not for their constituency, but for themselves. In other words, if I do this — what can I expect to gain for myself. Perhaps, we say, just to make it look better, what can I gain for my Ward or District.

In long ago days, to be a politician was a noble profession. A profession that was held in great respect. I don't know about you, but when I hear people railing against politicians, I get very

defensive. I think of the long hours I put in — I think of the long hours you put in, often at the expense of our families. There isn't a day of the week that I am not working at this Council job. Getting up at 4:30 A.M. to make a work appointment in Springfield and then rushing back to get here in time for a 5:00 meeting. Getting home most nights after 10:00 P.M.. Many times, eating dinner at that time — plus working a full time job, taking care of my home and taking care of my invalid mother. You might say "why do I do it?" and "Why do you do it?" Many of us do it because we love it and we want to do something for our Community, we want to give back something. Most of us do not do it in the hope of personal gains, now, or in the future.

You know, you can help and make all kinds of things happen in your neighborhood — new parks, new recreation centers, new schools, new housing, you name it. But, I can tell you what makes me stay on the City Council as long as I'm re-elected:

— The elderly man with no heat or hot water who you help to get an oil delivery;

— The kids you help get summer jobs for;

— The handicapped elderly couple you help to get into good, safe, subsidized housing;

— The 57 year old man who listens when you talk about the good that Dorcas Place does for those adults who can't read or write and then confesses that he can't read or write and would you help him get into the Program. That same man who came out of our Providence Public School System and now attends Dorcas daily and has a whole new lease on life.

That's what keeps me going!

Last Friday evening, for the first time since I was elected four years ago, I considered what I was doing here. I truly believe we discriminated against a former colleague. For whatever reason, lack of information or misrepresentation of

information we took away an opportunity he had to apply for a job that he was vastly qualified for. We told him in essence that sure, give twelve years of his life and many more prior to his election in government service but even though you may be qualified you cannot apply for this job because with the stroke of a pen, we removed that job from contention. We took it out of the Budget. Did we even consult with the Department Head? Of course not. Did we hear a presentation from the department? Of course not. When Planning and Development was scheduled with the Finance Committee to give a presentation, the Committee lacked a quorum and the meetings were canceled.

My whole reason for speaking tonight, and you're probably saying why doesn't she let this thing drop? Why beat a dead horse? My reason for speaking is that Friday night I saw something happen that could affect us all in the future. In a way it was kind of scary. I saw a man's reputation maligned. A man who was not present to defend himself. I know that the majority of the council voted because they felt it was the right thing to do. But, some of us voted that way because it's an election year and who wants to vote for something that might be a political liability. But, some of our motives were not quite so pure.

My question to everyone tonight is — should we go through the budget and take out more unfilled non union positions? In fact, I believe there are two such positions in the Council Budget. Should we take them out? Would that make us feel that we've done the honorable and ethical thing. No, in effect, we reserve the right to pick and choose which Council person can apply for a job if he loses an election or resigns from office, and the next time we have to make a similar decision, let's keep some things in mind:

1. By our vote, are we supporting a personal vendetta?

2. Are we so squeaky clean that we have never gotten a job for a friend, a family member or a politically connected person?

3. How many of us have accepted jobs for constituents and considered it our right to bargain for those jobs?

4. How many of us consider it perfectly acceptable to support someone for a job in an off election year — but, suddenly become aware of ethics in an election year.

I purposely did not lobby for Nick Easton for consideration for this job, I stayed out of it even though I believe he is more than qualified and I know he felt and John Palmieri felt that he was

very qualified. But, we took away his opportunity to be even considered for this job. As a few people said the other night, we don't owe Nick Easton anything — and we don't owe each other anything either. But, we do owe it to ourselves to be professional — to not assassinate someone's character on the floor — but, to treat all individuals with a sense of fairness — that did not happen the other night."

REPORTS FROM COMMITTEE

COUNCILMAN DAVID G. DILLON, Chairman COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

Transmits the following with Recommendation the Same be Approved:

Resolution relative to City Lease with the Providence Redevelopment Agency, and permanent financing related thereto.

Whereas, The Providence Redevelopment Agency (the "Agency") owns certain parcels of land located in the Capital Center District commonly referred to as Parcel 12 and Promenade Center; and

Whereas, The Agency previously issued short term notes in anticipation of the issuance of bonds (the "Notes") to finance expenses and costs relating to the purchase of Parcel 12 and Promenade Center (the "Projects") from the City of Providence (the "City"); and

Whereas, The City leases Parcel 12 and Promenade Center from the Agency pursuant to two

Leases dated June 15, 1991 duly executed by the City and the Agency (the "leases"); and

Whereas, The Leases provide for the City to pay to the Agency rentals in an amount sufficient to permit the Agency to make payments on the Notes and any Notes or Bonds issued to refund the Notes; and

Whereas, The Agency now desires to refund the Notes and to permanently finance the Projects through the issuance of Revenue Bonds,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the City Council hereby reaffirms and approves the Leases between the City of Providence and the Providence Redevelopment Agency for the lease of Parcel 12 and Promenade Center dated June 15,

1991 and the Agency's issuance of Revenue Bonds for the above purposes.
