RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 7

Approved January 12, 1976

WHEREAS, in His Divine Wisdom, Almighty God has called Unto Himself the soul of Carl G. Lauro, Acting Superintendent of Providence Public Schools, whose tenure of twenty-two years as an educator in the Providence School System, included assignments as a Teacher at Central High School, Head of the Science Department at Classical High School, where he taught Chemistry, Physics, Biology and Mathematics, all of which preceded his teaching assignment at Providence College, and

WHEREAS, Carl Lauro, amongst his other attributes, established an enviable record as Coach of the Track Team at Central High School, and

WHEREAS, a prolific writer, Mr. Lauro's publications included a published book on science and publications for the School Department, notably among them being the place of the Negro as a pioneer in science, and

Cianci, Jr., and the Members of the City Council pause in reflection of his myriad of contributions to the educational programs of the Providence Public Schools, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that most sincere expressions of sympathy are hereby expressed to his bereaved widow, Marie, and to their sons and daughters in this, their great loss.
