

Gentlemen:

On October 8, 1956 a resolution was referred to the Traffic Engineer for study and recommendation requesting that Wayne Street and Lydia Street be established as one-way streets.

In view of the widths of each of these streets, and in view of the type and quantity of traffic desiring to use these streets, it is the recommendation of this department that they be made one way. Specifically, it is recommended that Wayne Street be made one way easterly from Nolan Street to Douglas Avenue; and that Lydia Street be made one way easterly from Candace Street to Douglas Avenue.
