the following named person, firm or corporation is hereby granted permission to erect, alter or use a building or structure at the location named herein for the sale of petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil and their products, compounds and components as described and shown in and on the application therefor and accompanying plat, all on file in the office of the Inspector of Buildings subject to the conditions that said person, firm or corporation shall not violate any of the laws of the State of Rhode Island or any of the Ordinances of the City of Providence relative to the erection, use or occupation of said structure and that said person, firm or corporation shall not allow petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil or their products, compounds or components, to be conveyed over or across any sidewalk by means of any pipe or hose, and upon such special conditions as are hereby enumerated, viz:

Ward 13: Gildo Scannapieco, Aurel Barthell, and Hyman Parness, 1048 Westminster Street, Plat 29, Lots 209, 403, and 272, remove 2-3,000 gallon petroleum products storage tanks and two (2) filling pumps and replace with 1-4,000, 2-3,000 and 2-500 gallon petroleum products storage tanks and three (3) filling pumps, making 11,000 gallons total storage capacity and three (3) filling pumps on said lots.

The erection or location of any buildings or structures not shown on the original plat on file with the Inspector of Buildings or any change in the location of buildings or structures from that shown on said plat shall be deemed a violation of this permit.



TO THE HONORABLE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE:

The undersigned respectfully petitions your honorable body for

permission to erect a retractable loading dock on the westerly side of its premises facing South Water Street in the City of Providence, said premises being located on Assessors Plat 16, Lot 26.

Your petitioner operates a wholesale plumbing supply business at 231 South Main Street in the City of Providence, State of Rhode Island. Its premises is bounded on the north by Bullion Street, on the west by South Water Street, on the east by South Main Street, and on the south by Power Street. Entrance to the petitioner's warehouse is located on South Water Street and large trailer trucks delivering merchandise to said warehouse have been forced to back up to the entrance to said warehouse in order to unload in such a manner that said trucks block a large portion of the inbound lane of South Water Street. The Police Department of the City of Providence has objected on many occasions to this method of unloading. Due to the weight of the material unloaded, it has not been possible to park the trucks in any other manner than as described above. In an attempt to alleviate this situation, your petitioner has caused to be designed a retractable loading dock. The specifications of the same are attached hereto and marked Exhibit A. Said dock, when not in use, will be retracted up against the side of your petitioner's building and will not extend over the sidewalk. When lowered, said dock will extend into South Water Street a distance of eight (8) feet beyond the curb line. The proposed dock will be attached to the building by hinges and will be lowered and hoisted by an electric motor and a steel cable. Said dock is of heavy wooden construction and is so constructed that it will not raise or lower unless attended, due to the fact that a button on the motor must be depressed continually in order for the device to function. If this dock is constructed, trucks delivering merchandise to your petitioner's building will be able to park parallel to the curb instead of angle parking as heretofore. If this petition is granted, the dock will be constructed in strict compliance with the specifications contained in Exhibit A.

It is respectfully submitted that the construction of such a dock will be of benefit in aiding the flow of traffic on said South Water Street.


The Traffic Engineering Department has reviewed the petition of the Phillips Lead and Supply Company for permission to construct a retractable loading dock on the westerly side of its building, facing South Water Street. The statements made in the petition regarding the problems of loading and unloading into this building are correct, and this department has indicated to the petitioner our desire to seek some solution to the problem.

The possibility of installing the retractable loading dock was discussed with the petitioner, and the plans for the proposed loading dock had been reviewed by this office. The construction of the loading dock as proposed will permit vehicles to park parallel to the curb and at the same time permit the movement of heavy material in and out of the trucks by means of hand trucks or fork-lift trucks. By parking the trucks parallel to the curb, passage of other vehicles along South Water Street will be assured.

This movement by other vehicles is more important now than it has been in the past because of the establishment of South Main and South Water Streets as one-way streets. This change in one-way direction will necessitate additional volume using this portion of South Water Street and therefore, make any blockage of the street by trucks unloading at the petitioner's building in the manner formerly used a very serious problem.

It is therefore recommended that permission be granted the petitioner to construct the retractable loading dock as proposed.

Dear Sir:

The petitioner requests permission to erect a retractable loading dock, which would be attached to a building, and when lowered, would extend from the building across the sidewalk and eight (8) feet beyond the curb line into the highway.

The use of such a dock would make it possible to load or unload a truck while it is parked parallel to the curb and not interfere with vehicular traffic using the highway.

A condition similar to the one existing at this location also exists at many other locations throughout the City and it is to be noted that several years ago the owner's of a manufacturing building were required to cut an opening in a wall of their building and construct a loading platform within the building limits, so that trucks could be loaded without interfering with traffic in the highway in front of the building.

In the consideration of proposed encroachments or obstructions in a highway, we have accepted the principle that the highway belongs to the public and the placing therein of any obstruction, which constitutes a source of danger to the public or prevents the ordinary use thereof, should not be permitted.

The use of the dock, if installed, would prevent pedestrians from walking along the sidewalk and force them to walk into the highway around the dock, which in our opinion, would constitute a source of danger to them. The protrusion of the dock eight (8) feet beyond the curb line into the highway might also be considered as a source of danger to the public. In any event, the use of the dock would prevent the ordinary use of the highway.

Consequently, we recommend the denial of the petition.





Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Sec. 1. The last paragraphs of Sections 43.1 and 43.2
of Chapter 2 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Prov-
idence 1946, are hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 43.1 Fire uniform allotment account.

Subsequent to his first full year of service, each
fireman shall be entitled to receive fifty dollars each
year; provided, however, that each fireman regularly
required to wear dress uniform during his hours of duty
shall be entitled to receive sixty dollars each year.
Said sums shall be paid at such times and upon such
terms and conditions as may be prescribed by rule
or regulation adopted by the commissioner of public
safety and approved by the city controller.

Sec. 43.2 Police uniform allotment account.

Subsequent to his first full year of service each
uniformed police officer and police driver shall be
entitled to receive one hundred dollars each year to
be paid at such times and upon such terms and conditions
as may be prescribed by rule or regulation to be adopted
by the commissioner of public safety with the approval
of the city controller. Members of the department who
do not regularly wear uniforms shall also be entitled to
the aforesaid payment.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect January 1, 1958.
