Gentlemen:

The Housing Authority of the City of Providence, Rhode Island, is developing a housing project at Federal Hill (so-called) pursuant to approvals already given by the City Council of the City of Providence. These approvals were contained in Resolutions dated September 16, 1949 and September 21, 1962.

There is a legal requirement that, prior to the execution of an Annual Contributions Contract, the Local Authority shall notify the governing body of the locality of its estimate of the annual amount of payments in lieu of taxes which will be made for the project and of the amount of taxes which would be levied if the property were privately owned.

We wish to advise you that our estimate of the annual amount of payments in lieu of taxes is \$7,500.00 and of the annual amount of taxes which would be levied were the property privately owned is \$78,000.00.

Also, from our information, the actual taxes now being levied on the site of the proposed development is in the neighborhood of \$4,015.00.







We have completed our investigation which you requested of the need for "STOP" control at the intersection of Priscilla Avenue and Wallace Street.

Our studies show a very low volume of traffic on both streets. In addition, there have been only two reported accidents at this location in the past three years. In view of the satisfactory operation we do not recommend the establishment of "STOP" control at this intersection.


