WHEREAS, with the closing of the Biltmore Hotel, so-called, Motor Vehicle Traffic Control Signs presently existing along its' sides at Dorrance, Washington, Eddy and Worcester Streets, appear to be unnecessary and is, in some instances, encouraging all day parking of Motor Vehicles, and

WHEREAS, such unwarranted all day parking is self defeating and deprives the City much needed revenue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Traffic Engineer is requested to undertake a survey to consider the Removal of existing Traffic Control Signs along the Biltmore Hotel sides of Dorrance, Washington, Eddy and Worcester Streets, be removed and parking meters be installed in place, thereof, along the said streets.
