Sec. 61. Where no maximum limit is fixed on the total number of positions or the number of any individual class of position in a department, the number of persons appointed and employees shall be determined by the unexpended appropriation available.

Sec. 62. Chapter 1985-70 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence approved July 25, 1985, with all amendments and additions thereto, is hereby repealed and all other Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith, are likewise repealed.

Sec. 63. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

Section 1. The aforescribed Compensation Plan is hereby adopted for all City officers and employees and shall be applied to each, except as hereinafter described.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this ordinance, any and all employees in the Office of the Mayor shall be excepted from any salary established herein so long as the total of the compensation for such employees does not exceed the annual budget appropriation for personal services in the Office of the Mayor.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance the compensation for department heads and legal assistants to the City Solicitor shall be no greater than those herein specified; however, any department head or legal assistant to the City Solicitor may be compensated at a rate lower than that established herein, and that lower compensation shall be allowed by this ordinance.

Sec. 4. The provisions of this ordinance shall be retroactive to July 1, 1985.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
