LAWSON APPLICATION LICENSE AND SUPPORT, FY 2016, 2017 AND 2018

The Providence Information Technology Department respectfully requests approval to extend the contract with Infor/Lawson Software, 380 St. Peter St., St. Paul, MN, 55102-1302, for a three year period.

The Lawson contract provides application licensing, updates, security patches and support to the City's financial management, benefits and payroll systems. The City has standardized on this platform, and integrated the software with other financial and operational systems. There are no plans to replace the Lawson application at this time. The Lawson project contract was first negotiated in 2008 as part of a multi-year contract. Further approval to extend the contract was recently granted at an April, 2013 Board of Contract and Supply meeting.

The total cost of this contract shall not exceed \$250,000.00 per year. Funds are available in the Information Technology Budget, account 101-204-52040 for FY2016.
