*Now, Therefore, be it Resolved*, That the City Solicitor is requested to apply to the next session of the General Assembly and to urge passage of an Act providing for a mandatory jail sentence of not less than six months nor more than one year imprisonment, upon being convicted for taking from the person a purse, wallet, or any container in which a person's personal effects are being carried.

Dear Governor Noel:

At a meeting of the Committee of Claims and Pending Suits of the Providence City Council held on December 9, 1975, a glaring inequity in property (motor vehicle) assessment for the purpose of taxation came to light.

There was apparently an unwritten agreement formulated between the new car dealers of the City of Providence and the City of Providence's Tax Assessors Department during a past administration. The agreement, in principal, involved a negotiated flat rate valuation for new car inventories on a continuing basis, with no relationship to the actual value of said inventories. Information was conveyed at the meeting which

indicated that the agreement was formulated in response to dealers' demands that the City of Providence value dealers' inventories in a manner consistent with values imposed by neighboring cities and towns, or that it might be necessary to consider moving dealerships to those cities and towns that provide a more advantageous valuation.

As the Governor of our State and a former practicing attorney, I am sure that you are aware of the fact that both the State and Federal Courts have expounded on the necessity of assessing property uniformly, and they have, in certain circumstances, ordered uniform assessment for the purposes of taxation. From the information presented at the Committee hearing it would appear that the valuation imposed on new car dealers' inventories is both arbitrary and capricious, depending upon the assessing authority. This results, in effect, in the creation of a special class for the purposes of taxation.

It is imperative that your Administration demonstrate leadership in mitigating this oppressive inequity. I would suggest the immediate formulation and enactment of legislation that would provide that a State officer be required to set a value on every motor vehicle, both wholesale and retail by year, make and model for the purposes of assessment. The enactment should also include a provision making it mandatory that the several cities and towns use the values so set in assessing motor vehicles.

I am concerned that the individual owner of a motor vehicle has a valuation placed on his vehicle that is totally inconsistent with and which bears no reasonable resemblance to the identical vehicle owned by a dealership. Similarly, I question the reasoning that holds that identical vehicle held by dealerships in different taxing jurisdictions should have a different valuation placed thereon. I am sure that you recognize that the creation of a special class of taxpayers that does not fully assume its responsibilities imposes an inequitable burden on the rest of the taxpayers who do not enjoy the privilege of the special class.

This inequity should not be fostered and allowed to perpetuate itself unchecked. I cannot, and I will not condone a system that operates to the detriment of the ordinary taxpayer, who already is suffering from the economic ills of our environment. I ask for your assistance in giving relief to the many voiceless taxpayers who are bearing a disproportionate share of the tax burden.

Trusting that this situation will receive your prompt attention and immediate affirmative action, I am

Dear Senator:

I am writing to you to ask for your assistance in mitigating an inequitable tax burden that has been imposed upon Providence new car dealers. Once again, it has been clearly demonstrated that there is a need for uniform property assessments (see attached article from the Providence Journal). It would appear that clear and convincing action is needed by the State Legislature if this goal is to be achieved. It is my conviction that movement toward the goal of tax-equalization could be fostered by implementation of a plan involving motor vehicles, due to the extreme ease of classification by year and model.

The dealerships in the City of Providence should no longer be forced to compete at an

economic disadvantage with those dealerships in outlying communities due to the inconsistency of valuations placed on inventories by the various communities. The perpetuation of this inequitable system of valuations for the purpose of taxation will cause Providence dealers to re-evaluate their commitment to doing business in our City. Subsequent appraisals of the local business environment could lead to a further movement of our dealerships to the surrounding communities. This could lead to the loss of employment of our citizens and a deterioration of our base of taxable property.

I have enclosed herewith a copy of a letter I delivered to the Office of the Governor seeking the support and assistance of his administration. I urge you to work for and support this program of tax equalization as suggested in the aforementioned letter.

*The Power to Tax is the Power to Destroy!*  
Your failure to support state wide tax valuations for dealer's inventories could conceivably destroy the last vestiges of new car dealerships in the City of Providence.

I look forward to hearing from you relative to the cooperation that can be expected in promoting this legislation that will benefit not only the local businessmen, but all the citizens of the City of Providence.
