

- Request approval to enter into a contract with **Green & Healthy Homes Initiative (GHHI)** to assist in executing the City's Lead Safe Providence Program in the amount not to exceed **\$83,765.50** in accordance with the Code of Ordinance, Section 21-26 (b).
- Request approval to enter into a contract with **Prospect Chartercare St. Joseph Health Services (SJHC)** to assist in executing the City's Lead Safe Providence Program in the amount not to exceed **\$91,024.50** in accordance with the Code of Ordinance, Section 21-26 (b).

Dear Mayor Elorza:

The Department of Planning and Development is requesting approval to enter into a contract with Community Action Partnership Providence (CAPP), 518 Hartford Avenue, Providence, RI 02909 to assist in enrolling households and processing applications for the City's Lead Safe Providence Program. A total amount not to exceed \$444,196.00 will be paid out of account 239-4020-53420-40 over the forty-two-month federal grant period ending July 3, 2024.

In September 2020, the City of Providence was awarded a \$5.7 million Lead Hazard Reduction Demonstration grant to address the lead-based paint hazards in Providence households. CAPP was listed as a sub-recipient on this grant to conduct bilingual public outreach, home visits, and education to low-income households throughout the community. As part of the grant application the City of Providence committed to co-enroll 50 units to receive lead abatement and weatherization services. The allocated funds will be utilized towards salaries, occupancy costs, mileage, and outreach expenses. CAPP will also provide weatherization services to 50 Lead Safe Providence Program units as a match to the City's efforts (match value: \$220,000). CAPP is the only organization within the City that can provide this match service.
