Dear Senator Green:

Thank you for your letter of January 30, 1960, and for the enclosed clipping from the Providence Evening Bulletin dated January 28, 1960.


We quite agree with you that there is a demonstrated need in Rhode Island for our Providence hospital. We have no plans now or in the foreseeable future to abandon or close this hospital.

The comparison mentioned in the newspaper article as to length of stay in Veterans Administration hospitals with non-VA hospitals does not afford us a proper basis for analysis since over-all length of stay in any hospital is of course controlled by many variables, such as nature of disability.

With respect to the comment to place more emphasis on financial need for hospitalization, our standard operating procedures require veterans applying for hospital care for a non-service connected condition to swear under oath that they are financially unable to pay expenses of hospital care. In addition to this sworn statement, the Veterans Administration requires all such applicants to submit a financial statement, listing their income, the value of any property holdings, and their total ready assets along with expenditures and indebtedness. This statement contains a warning that a knowing false statement subjects the applicant to possible prosecution in a United States Court.

Thank you again for giving us an opportunity to state our position with regard to the Providence hospital.





## ORGANIZATION AND FUNCTIONS

### LEGAL BASIS

The City Plan Commission operates under two basic legal documents. The State Enabling Act and the Ordinance adopted by the Providence City Council in 1944. The first authorizes the cities and towns of the State of Rhode Island to establish planning agencies, and lists some of their powers and responsibilities. The second prescribes the organization and specific duties of the City Plan Commission.

### MEMBERSHIP

The City Plan Commission consists of the Mayor (ex officio), five qualified citizens appointed by the Mayor, and two councilmanic members elected by the City Council.

### STAFF

The technical work for the Commission is carried on by a staff headed by Director Frank H. Malley who is appointed by the Commission.

### BUDGET

The Department operated under a budget of \$74,362 not including Demonstration Grant project budgets. Expenditures for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1959 and for the previous year, 1957-1958, are tabulated in Appendix A.

### OPERATIONS

1. The purpose of the Department is to give technical advice and assistance to the Mayor, the City Council, and the various departments and boards of the city administration, and to the people of the community.
2. The major role of the Department is the preparation and review of the various elements of a Master Plan of the City of Providence. These are developed by the staff and adopted by the Commission.
3. All matters which come before the City Council dealing with physical improvements within the city are required by ordinance to be referred to the Commission for study and advisory opinions. The Director advises on all cases coming before the Zoning Board of Review.

Since the Department's inception in 1944, it has dealt with 1,114 Council Referrals, and 1,482 Board of Review Referrals. In Appendix B, Part I is a tabulation of the City Council Referrals for 1958-1959, and Part II is a tabulation of the Board of Review Referrals for the past fiscal year.

4. The Department publishes each element of the Master Plan as it is completed. A list of the Master Plans and special reports which have been published since 1944 will be found in Appendix C.

## MAJOR WORK UNDERTAKEN, 1958-1959

### COLLEGE HILL DEMONSTRATION STUDY OF HISTORIC AREA RENEWAL

The College Hill Project was terminated in December 1958 and the report printed and delivered in July 1959. Two thousand copies were printed; seven hundred were sent to the Demonstration Grant Office of the H.H.F.A.; three hundred given to the Providence Preservation Society (which contributed \$20,000 to the study) and one thousand copies retained by the City Plan Commission for distribution. Of this latter amount seven hundred have been mailed out to those on our mailing list. The report has already received widespread favorable publicity.

Locally several important steps towards realization of the twenty-five year MASTER PLAN have been taken, following proposals documented under the report chapter "Recommended Program".

#### College Hill Committee

A permanent "Committee for the Implementation of the College Hill Report" has been formed; their function is to coordinate efforts of implementation. Mr. Frank H. Malley, the City Plan Director, is a member of this Committee.

#### Roger Williams Spring Park

The Roger Williams Spring National Historic Park site has been proposed as a memorial to the founder of Providence and is now being actively studied by the National Park Service. This Park is a goal of both the College Hill and Downtown Providence Studies.

#### Historic Area Zoning

A State Enabling Act for Historic Area Zoning was prepared by the City Plan Commission in conjunction with Blair Associates, Planning Consultants, as part of the study, and was subsequently passed by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island and enacted into law on May 27, 1959. The purpose of this Act is to safeguard the heritage of the cities or towns by preserving those districts that reflect elements of their cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history; to stabilize and improve property values; to foster civic beauty; to strengthen the local economy; to promote the use of historic areas for the education, pleasure and welfare of the people and to insure that future developments are in harmony with the historic and architectural character of the area.

#### Private Investment

There are several groups buying and restoring the early houses in College Hill. The Burnside Corporation has purchased 15; these have been restored on the exterior and the purchasers restore the interior; Foxes Hill have purchased 3, one of which has been completely renovated and is rented; ten houses have been purchased by individuals and are presently being restored. The Episcopal Diocese of Rhode Island is purchasing houses along one block of Benefit Street, the exterior to be restored and the interior to be converted into apartments for the elderly.

Of great importance is the fact that recommendations, made in the College Hill Report, that the banks work out ways to make favorable loans to individuals and groups interested in buying old houses have been followed.

## DOWNTOWN PROVIDENCE MASTER PLAN PROJECT

### I. INTRODUCTION

Being a Demonstration Grant Project under Section 314 of the Federal Housing Act of 1954, the Downtown Providence Master Plan Project has two purposes, (1) to develop a Master Plan for the Downtown Area and (2) to demonstrate how this plan can be developed in close association with those civic, professional and business interests concerned with the revitalization and renewal of the Central Business District of Providence.

The \$164,846.00 study is being financed by a \$107,987.00 grant from the Federal Government, \$35,975.00 in staff time and services contributed by the City of Providence, and \$20,794.00 from funds raised through private subscription by the Downtown Business Coordinating Council of the Greater Providence Chamber of Commerce. (See Annual Report fiscal year ended 1958 for project background.)

### II. PROGRESS REPORT

Work on the Project actually began in August of 1957 and is scheduled to end during the spring of 1960 when the final printed report will be available. The activities of the project during the fiscal year ended 1958 are reported in last year's Annual Report, and at length in a report of the first two phases of the project published in October 1958 entitled "Downtown Providence".

The main emphasis during fiscal year 1958-1959 was on the Design Phase of the Master Plan itself. This design is based upon planning objectives established early in the study and upon the economic evaluation of downtown, the city, and the metropolitan area by Mr. Joseph Turley of Boston, the Economic Consultant engaged for the project. Mr. Turley's conclusions indicate that Downtown Providence must establish itself as a regional shopping center serving the large metropolitan area, and not merely the city, if it is to survive. Planning for downtown's future is being built around this concept.

The design is also predicated on the completion of the proposed freeway loop and the metropolitan highway system which will provide fast and easy access to the downtown area from all over the state for the first time in a generation. The success of any downtown revitalization is largely dependent upon the early completion of the freeway system and the construction of the hurricane barrier.

During the past year the following major elements were being developed and will be recommended as part of the Master Plan when it is presented early in 1960:

- 1 - Based upon the completed freeway loop a new traffic circulation plan featuring two slow speed inner loops permitting easy vehicular movement within the area, improved efficient facilities for delivery vehicles, and the re-routing of intra-city transit service.

within the area.

2 - A larger new inter-city transit depot with easy access to the freeway.

3 - Relocation of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad tracks and station making 50 acres of land available for redevelopment.

4 - A strategically located civic center to house city, state, and federal offices.

5 - A plan for an integrated system of parking garages and lots.

6 - The establishment of a permanent pedestrian shopping mall along Westminster Street from Dorrance to Empire Streets with cross malls on Union and Mathewson Streets.

7 - New retail facilities such as a home fashion center, a new department store and the replacement of some of the old obsolete retail structures.

8 - The expansion of the cultural facilities of the area to include a Museum of Natural History, a convention-exhibition hall, and an entertainment center.

9 - The renewal of Weybosset Hill as a housing and institutional area. In this connection plans are already underway for the Providence Housing Authority to acquire the site bounded by Broad, Foster, Pine Streets and the freeway loop for a 200 unit high-rise apartment house for the elderly.

### III. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

The development of the above elements of the plan were worked out by the project staff with the close cooperation and participation of the citizen organization consisting of the Downtown Business Coordinating Council and its constituent groups. This citizen organization composed of the Master Plan Advisory Committee and four Task Forces (Design, Financial and Legal, Human Relations, and Public Relations) in addition to the Downtown Business Coordinating Council has made a real contribution to the development of the Master Plan.

The Design Task Force, composed of local architects and engineers, met regularly with the staff to review the basic circulation and land use plan and the specific design of each element which was being developed. The housing for the elderly to be built in the Weybosset Hill area as recommended by this project is being planned by the Providence Housing Authority with assistance from the Design Task Force.

Under study by the Financial and Legal Task Force are the Off-Street Parking Statute, the legal aspects of the pedestrian mall, and the financial program to implement some of the aspects of the Master Plan.

The recommendation for housing and institutional land use for the Weybosset Hill Section and some of the cultural facilities

were jointly developed by the staff and the Human Relations Task Force. This Task Force is studying the type of organization that will be formed to implement the forthcoming Master Plan.

To assure an awareness of the downtown problems and the need for the Master Plan for renewal the Public Relations Task Force conducted a most effective publicity program during the year. Cooperation on the part of the local newspaper, radio and television, and other media has made it possible to bring the need for downtown renewal to the public. The coming fiscal year will find the Task Force conducting a campaign to "sell" the Master Plan to the people so that this plan, as has happened to so many plans will not be "received and placed on file".

#### IV. THE COMING YEAR

Fiscal year 1959-1960 will be an important one for the City of Providence for the Master Plan for Downtown will be presented to the people. The value of the plan will be measured by how well it is received and by how well it is implemented. The challenge is upon us all, private and public enterprise alike, to accept this plan and carry it out.

#### CENTRAL-CLASSICAL STUDY

At the request of the School Department a study of the Central-Classical school complex was undertaken. As these schools are located within a Redevelopment Project Area the re-use planning of this project was coordinated with the school planning. The many varieties of existing land uses within this project area present several re-use problems. Because of this the Redevelopment Agency requested the staff of the City Plan Commission to prepare a proposed District Land Use Map which is to be a part of the Agency's final application to be submitted to the Housing and Home Finance Agency.

#### HOUSING FOR THE ELDERLY

The Department staff assisted the Providence Housing Authority in the feasibility of site location for housing of the elderly. A survey of several sites was made in regard to this need and from this survey it was recommended that priority be given to the following sites: (1) Weybosset Hill, near the downtown area (2) the Laurel Hill Avenue playground site. The Weybosset Hill Project will make it possible to take care of a number of the elderly persons who will be forced to vacate from the path of the North-South Freeway.

#### MARKET STUDY

Due to the contemplated displacement of a number of Wholesale Food Distributors by the North-South Freeway and by Redevelopment, especially in connection with the Roger Williams Spring National Historic Park, a market survey was suggested to explore the possibility of locating all of the local Wholesale Food Distributors on one site. This study is to be a joint undertaking by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, the State Department of Agriculture and Conservation and the City Plan Commission.



## CITY BEAUTIFICATION PROGRAM

A program outline for City Beautification was prepared at the request of Mayor Reynolds. This program would encompass the following elements of City Beautification:

### PUBLIC

(a) parks, (b) playgrounds, (c) street rights-of-way, other than road surface, (d) street furniture, (e) freeway rights-of-way, other than paved surface, (f) waterways and adjacent public shoreline, and (g) miscellaneous city-owned structures and property (fire, police, school, dumps, etc.).

### PRIVATE

(h) private property and structures (under existing legislation, (i) railroad rights-of-way and (j) parking lots.

### CONTINUING ACTIVITIES

### CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

The Department in collaboration with the Finance Director submitted to the City Council a Capital Improvement Program for 1959 through 1965 of \$28,441,625 which includes \$3,793,500 for the Water Supply Board. The total Capital Budget for 1959-1960 is \$5,947,125 exclusive of the Water Supply Board. Of this latter amount \$35,000 is to be financed from current revenue and the remainder \$5,912,125 is to be financed from bond issues. This submission of Capital Budget and Capital Improvement Program has been routine for the past ten years.

### RECREATION

Study and site plans were prepared and completed for a Launching Ramp on the Seekonk River, just north of the Washington Bridge. Study and site plans were also prepared and completed for the Danforth Street School and recreation area.

### PUBLIC INFORMATION

The City Plan Commission continues its established policy of keeping the citizens and the various organizations of the city well informed of its operations and its proposals for the future development of the city. News coverage of planning affairs has been excellent.
