No. **231 AN ORDINANCE** AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE
CHAPTER 1222 BY APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY
(\$250.00) DOLLARS TO THE AMERICAN VETERANS, WORLD WAR II,
DEPARTMENT CONVENTION.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1: Chapter 1222 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence as approved September 19, 1958, and entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$36,888,118.22 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1959", as amended, is hereby further amended by appropriating the sum of Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars to the AMERICAN VETERANS, WORLD WAR II, DEPARTMENT CONVENTION.

SECTION 2: The money hereby appropriated shall be paid to the Treasurer of the 1959 American Veterans, World War II, Department Convention, to help defray expenses of the American Veterans, World War II, Department Convention to be held in the City of Providence June 19, 20 and 21, 1959.

SECTION 3: The said sum of Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars as hereby appropriated shall be obtained by authorizing and directing the City Controller and City Treasurer to transfer a like amount from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account to the Receipt Account.

SECTION 4: The Estimated Receipts from Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures are hereby increased by the sum of Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

CHIEF OF OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE**(Sewage Disposal Works)**

CLASS TITLE: Chief of Operations and Maintenance

CLASS DEFINITION: Responsible for the proper operation and maintenance of the Sewage Disposal Works, to include the treatment and disposal of sewage and the maintenance of all mechanical and electrical equipment. Receives general instructions from the Superintendent of the Sewage Disposal Works, but is individually responsible for plant operation and maintenance.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF WORK: Work involves responsibility for giving technical instructions to and supervision of the Sewage Disposal Works and Maintenance Foremen in the operation and maintenance of the Sewage Treatment and Disposal Plant.

SAMPLES OF WORK: (Note: The following examples of work are only illustrative of the kind of work to be performed by persons of this class and are not intended to be all inclusive or exclusive.) Assigns, instructs and supervises the work of the Sewage Disposal Works Foremen and their subordinates in the operation of the Plant and the Maintenance Foremen and his subordinates in the maintenance of the Plant.

NECESSARY KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Considerable knowledge, such as may have been gained on the job, of the operation and maintenance of a Sewage Treatment and Disposal Plant. Working knowledge of equipment, methods and technique commonly used in the treatment and disposal of sewage, with the ability to recognize and correct operational difficulties. Also, working knowledge of the maintenance and repair of equipment, mechanical and electrical, used in the treatment and disposal of sewage, with the ability to recognize and correct mechanical failures. Ability to understand and efficiently carry out written or oral instructions.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED FOR APPOINTMENT: Considerable experience in the operation of a Sewage Treatment and Disposal Plant and the maintenance of equipment used in the treatment and disposal of sewage, preferably an activated sludge type of treatment plant. Completion of eight grades of Grammar School, but preferably graduation from High School, and satisfactory experience as a Sewage Disposal Works Operating Foremen and a Sewage Disposal Works Maintenance Foreman.

CHIEF INDUSTRIAL REPRESENTATIVE
(Providence Redevelopment Agency)

CLASS TITLE: Chief Industrial Representative(Providence Redevelopment Agency)

CLASS DEFINITION: To Perform complex and responsible work in a program for the development of plans and contacts for establishing new industries and for aiding existing industries in the City of Providence; to plan, undertake and supervise surveys and studies relating thereto; to maintain files and current inventory of vacant industrial and commercial sites and buildings; to carry out a full scale promotional program, to organize citizens support and take active participation in civic programs designed to further industrial expansion; to plan and carry out educational programs to further the expansion of the industrial base of the city; to plan and organize industrial or commercial expositions; and to do related work as required.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED: Works under the general supervision of the Executive Director from whom assignments are received with a statement of objectives desired; work is reviewed upon completion for adherence to desired objectives.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED: As required, plans and supervises the work of technical and clerical assistants.

ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF WORK PERFORMED: To perform complex and responsible work in a program for the development of plans and contacts for establishing new industries and for aiding existing industries in the City of Providence. To plan, undertake and supervise surveys and studies relating to; existing vacant factory space and its physical descriptions, labor supply, wage rates, taxes, zoning and other ordinances, and other related data. As required, to personally examine such vacant plant space and to study layout for the purpose of ascertaining their utilization by a specific industry. To meet with prospective occupants of such buildings and make available to them the results of such surveys and studies. To cooperate with representatives of the State, City, Civic and other organizations in locating and evaluating vacant industrial real estate. To make available to industries the results of surveys and studies concerning federal government regulations, local transportation facilities, availability and costs of utilities, domestic and foreign commerce, and other data of a pertinent nature. To consult with United State military and governmental agencies in order to obtain data relative to orders for products which Providence industries can fill and to prepare reports thereon. To contact and bring together industrial realtors or property owners with prospective industrial or mercantile concerns for the purpose of acquiring or renting property. To do related work as required.

KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: A knowledge of the existing types of industries in Rhode Island and the products manufactured; a working knowledge of the availability of additional industrial processes involved in the manufacture of these products; the ability to plan, supervise and undertake studies and surveys relating to: the kinds of available plant sites, available plant space, available machinery and equipment and their adequacy for acceptability or adaptability for present or other uses, the kind of labor available, the availability of raw materials, transportation facilities, water supply and power, the current and potential domestic and foreign markets, etc.; the ability to meet with business executives and to make preliminary negotiations leading to the ultimate establishment of new or additional businesses in the City of Providence; and related capacities and abilities.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:

Education: Graduation from a college of recognized standing with a Bachelor's degree.

Experience: Employment in a position which has provided a working knowledge of the kinds and types of Rhode Island industrial plants and manufacturing operations such as may have been gained by an industrial realtor or an industrial representative or industrial specialist or industrial consultant.

Or, any combination of education and experience that shall be substantially equivalent to the above education and experience, Master's or Doctor's degree may substitute for experience.

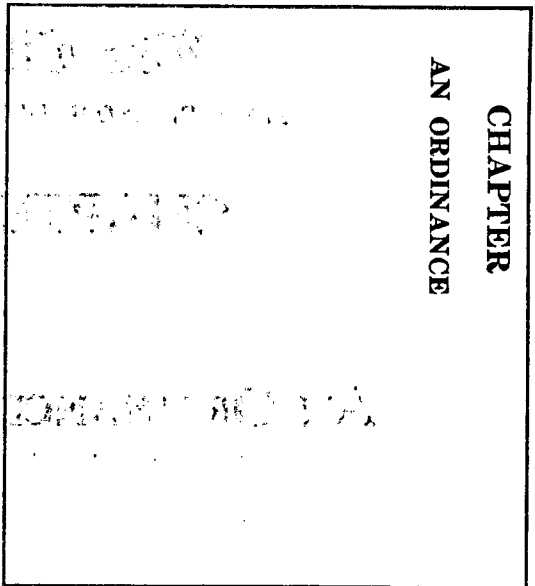

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 235

Approved April 3, 1959

Resolved,

That the City Treasurer, acting under the direction of the Committee on Finance, be and he hereby is authorized and directed to borrow from time to time such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding one million (\$1,000,000) dollars, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 17 of the Public Laws, passed by the General Assembly at its January Session, A. D. 1959, and approved March 30, 1959, entitled "An Act Authorizing the City of Providence to Issue Bonds in the sum of One Million (\$1,000,000) Dollars for a Public Works--Highway Office Building and Garage", and to issue the City's notes therefor, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding three and one-half (3½%) per cent per annum, signed by him, and countersigned by the Mayor and Chairman of the Finance Committee; and to renew any such notes from time to time as the same become due. The money thus obtained is hereby appropriated for and shall be used and expended for the construction, furnishing and equipping of a Public Works--Highway Office Building and Garage.
