No. 243 **AN ORDINANCE** AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE CHAPTER 1979-30, APPROVED JUNE 22, 1979, BY TRANSFERRING CERTAIN SUMS OF MONEY WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Approved May 3, 1980

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

Section 1. Chapter 1979-30 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, as approved June 22, 1979, and entitled: "An Ordinance Making an Appropriation of \$117,978,739.44 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1980," is hereby further amended by transferring certain sums of money within the Department of Public Schools, as follows:




Please consider this letter as a request to convene the City Council Finance Committee as soon as possible to consider the School Department Ordinance, Item 9a. of the City Council Docket of March 20, 1980.

As you are aware, said Ordinance deals with transfers of monies only and does not increase the School Budget.

The urgency of this request is based mainly on our needs to provide additional funds in the fuel oil line and by doing so to prevent a deficit in Item 2, which is contrary to City Charter requirements.
