Dear Mayor:


It is particularly gratifying for me to be able to report that the number of serious crimes reported in Providence in 1972 was 13.5% below the previous year's total. This represents the greatest single year reduction in the past decade. In his congratulatory letter to the members of this department about this significant achievement, and in referring to the somewhat smaller drop in crime nationally, the President of the United States was quite right in stating: "...many have worked to bring it about".

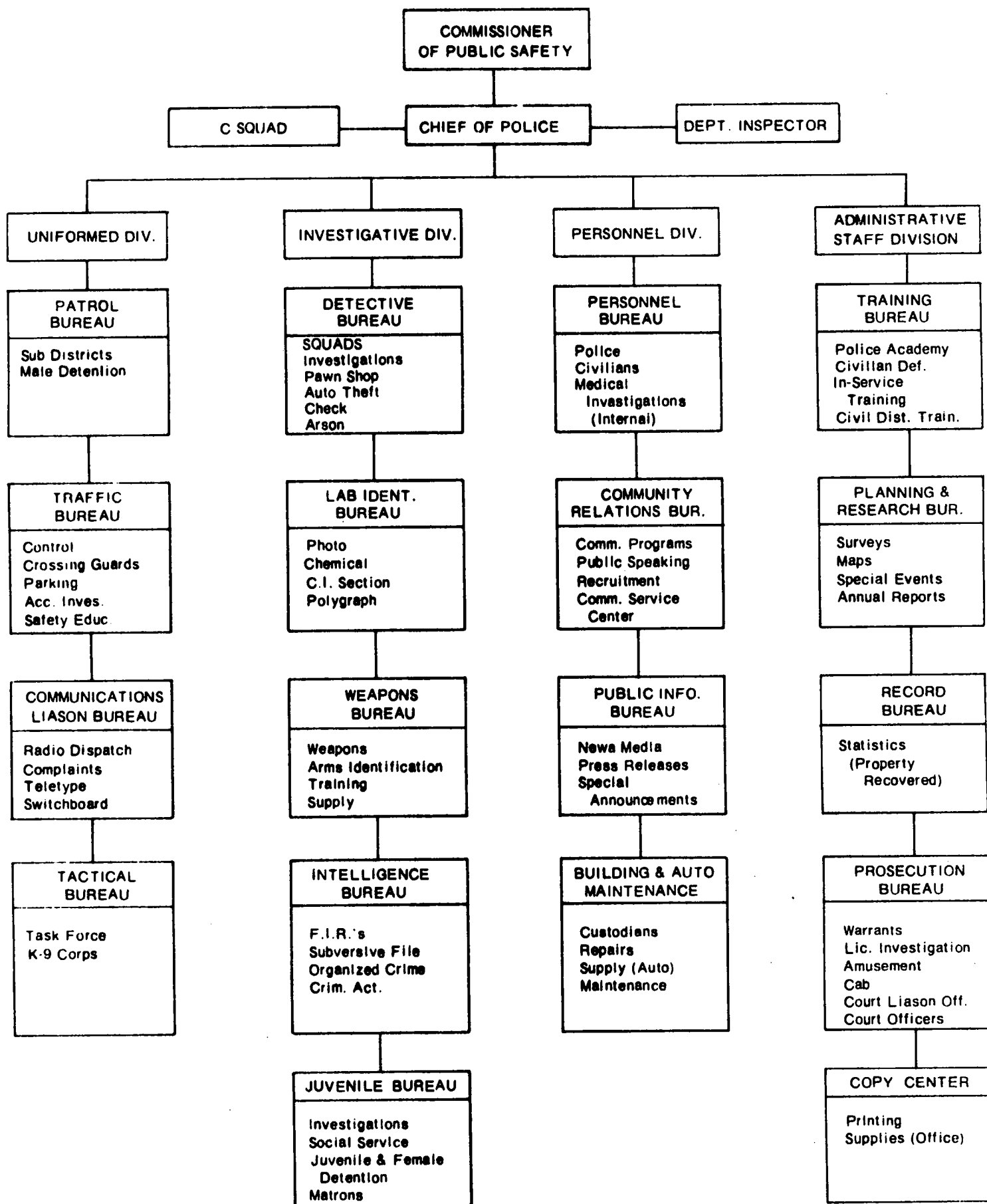
The 1972 profile of the city's crime rate was not the only change visible to our citizens. Perhaps the most visible change they saw in the local police environment was our departure from the 108-year use of "blue" as the department's uniform color for the more eye-catching two-tone brown and the adoption of the same colors for the new police automotive fleet.

Other new dimensions of local police service included further organizational structuring of department units, expansion of existing bureaus and services, the creation of new sections, and some work-time shift changes - all of which gave the department more flexibility for combating predictable and unpredictable street crimes. Police training and college education programs for police officers were expanded and added to the professionalism of Providence policemen. New projects supported jointly by the city and the federal government's Law Enforcement Assistance Administration also comprised part of our 1972 experience and made possible further innovations in local law enforcement.

The year 1973 undoubtedly will present new challenges for this department. On behalf of all of its police officers and civilian employees, let me assure you that with God's help and the same support we received last year from our fellow citizens, from your office and others in local, state, and federal government, the police department will successfully overcome most of the problems ahead and will contribute to the many socio-economic dynamics that are making Providence "the place to be in '73" and for many more years to come.

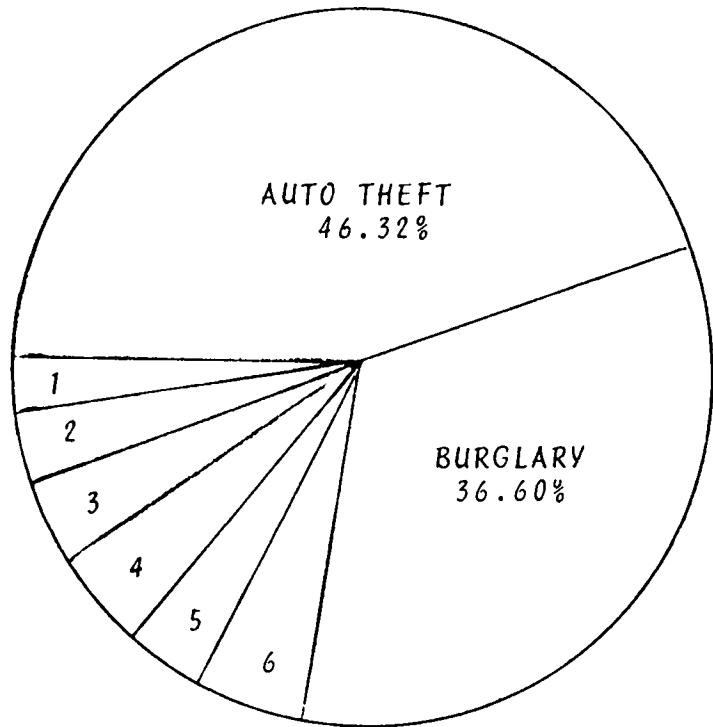

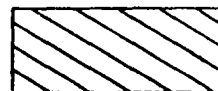

CLEARANCE OF PART 1 OFFENSES REPORTED TO THE POLICE

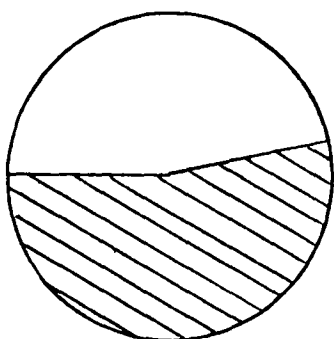

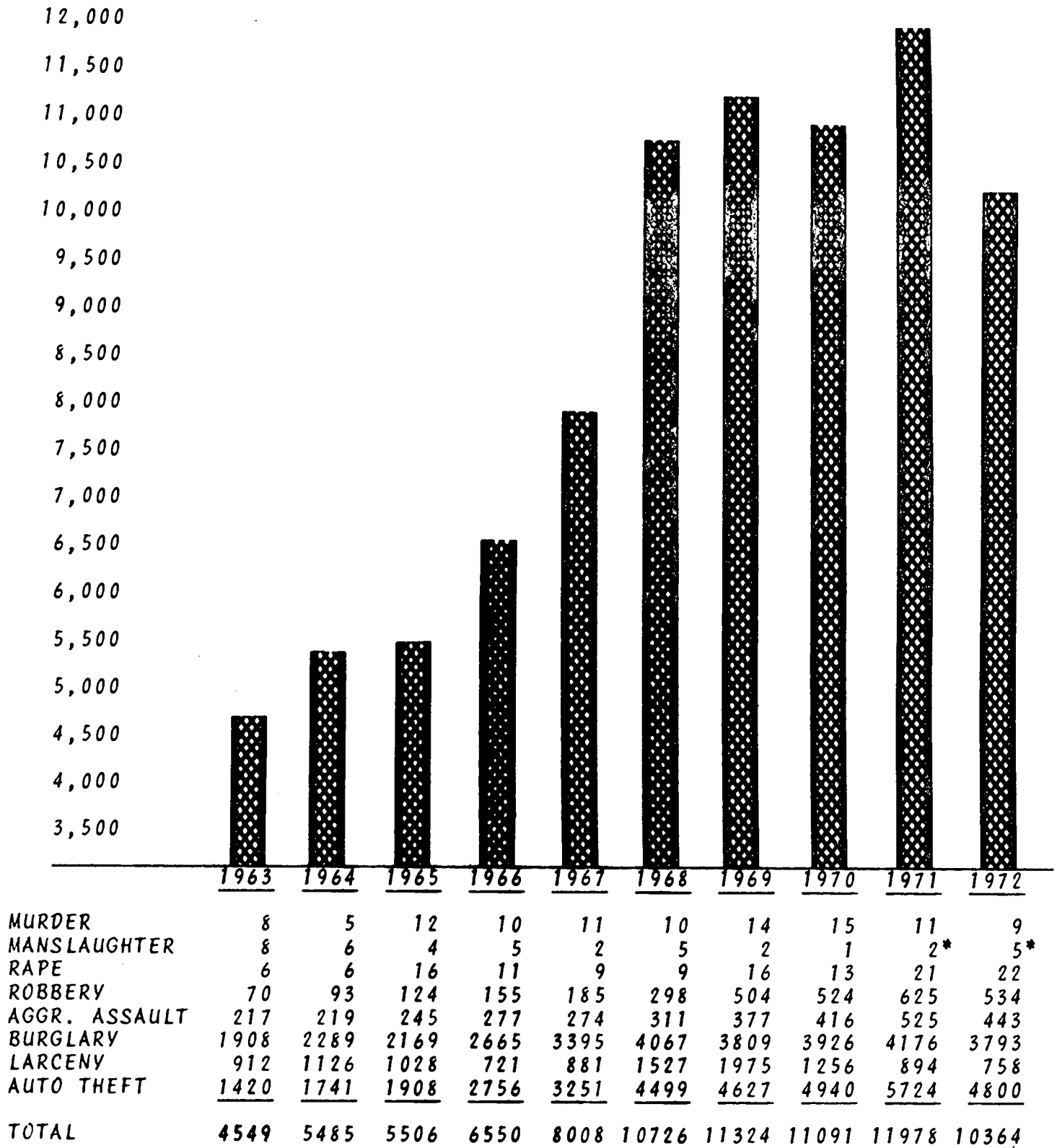

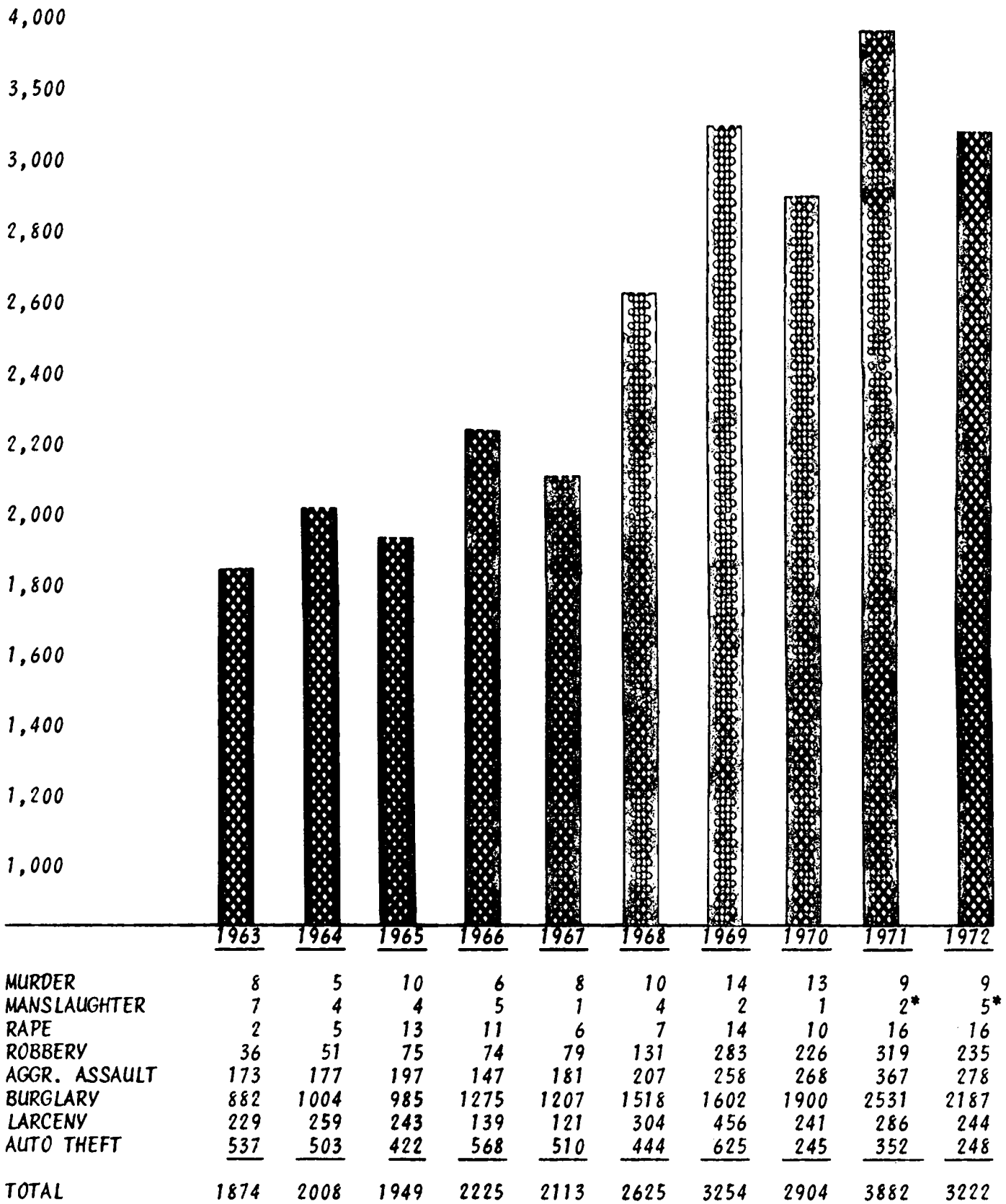

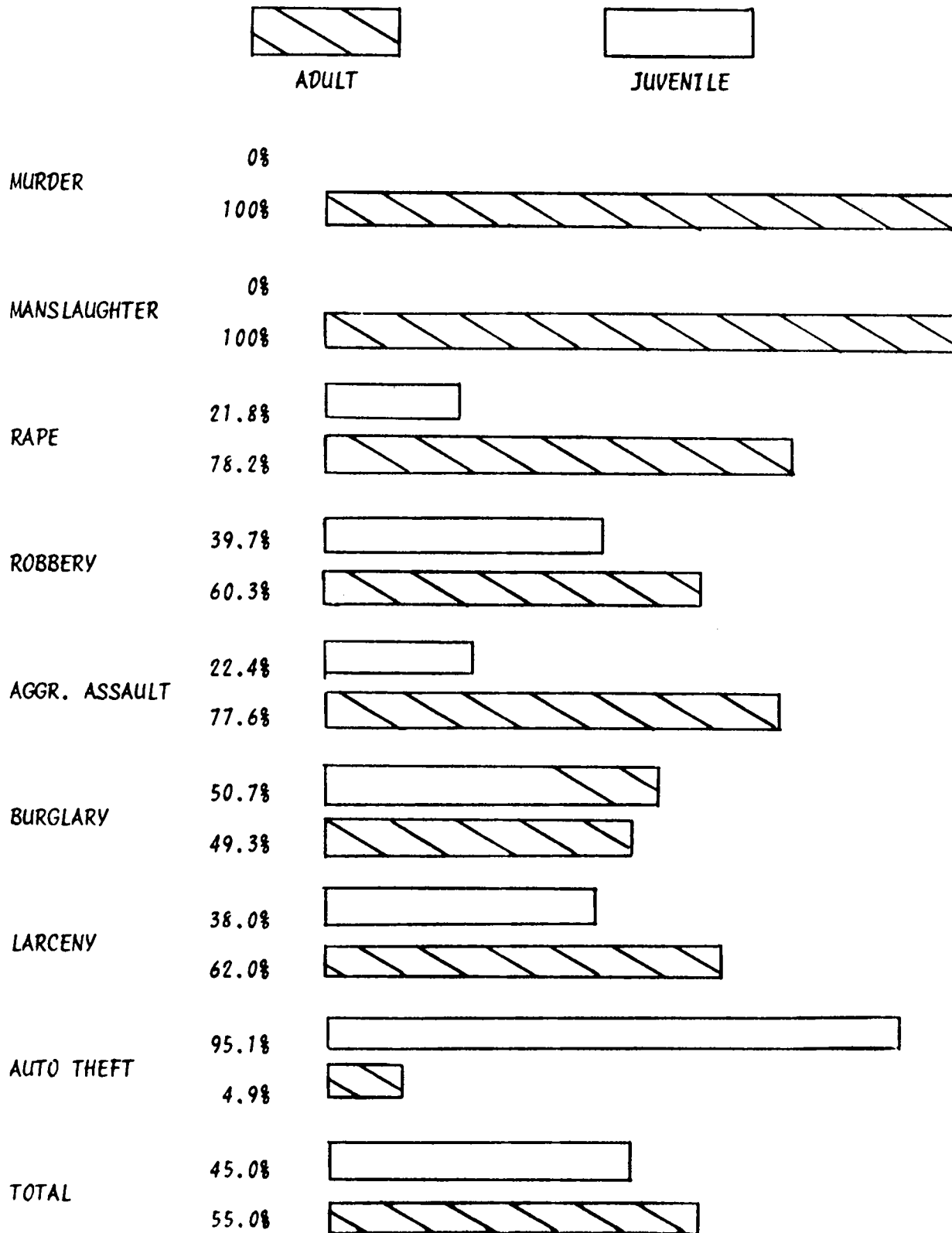

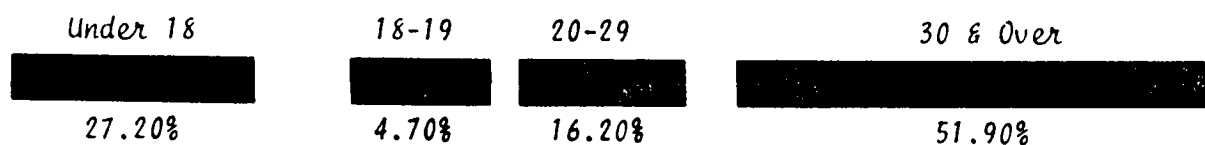

ADULT-JUVENILE ARRESTS FOR PART 1 OFFENSES IN PROVIDENCE FOR 1972

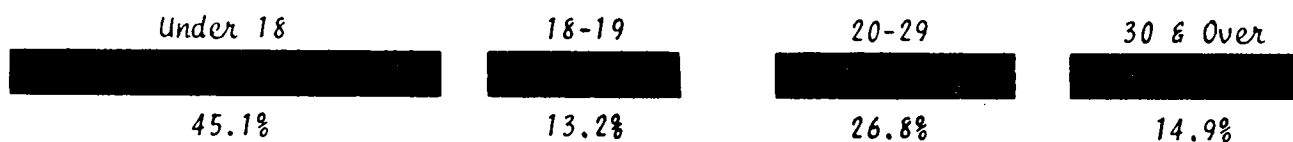


COMPARISON OF POPULATION AGE GROUPS TO ARREST AGE GROUPS

PROVIDENCE POPULATION BY AGE GROUPS*



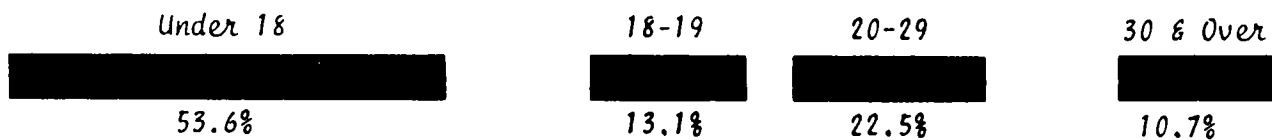
PERSONS ARRESTED FOR PART 1 OFFENSES
