Be it Ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Chapter 8, Article 2 of the Code of

Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended by adding the following:

Section 8-27. Housing Court fees — The Housing Court shall be allowed the following fees in full, to be taxed in the bill of costs of every civil action:

For entry of every civil action,
or petition \$100.00

Section 8-28. The City of Providence exempt from fees — The City of Providence, its departments, agencies, boards and commissions shall not be required to pay any fees, including appeal fees, to the Housing Court or the clerk thereof, provided however, That fees and charges authorized by law shall nevertheless be taxable as costs.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
