

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 584

Approved December 13, 1973

WHEREAS, it has become apparent, in recent weeks, that the State and Nation is facing the greatest Energy Crisis in its history, and

WHEREAS, Providence, the Capitol City of Rhode Island, is the largest consumer of energy for use in industry, government, and the public sector, and, as such, should be in the forefront of efforts to conserve and economize in their area as much as possible,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that His Honor the Mayor be and he hereby is requested to appoint a Blue Ribbon Study Commission from among the City's leaders in government, industry, energy, and the public sector, to undertake a complete study of the Energy Crisis, so-called, as it pertains to the City of Providence, to develop a set of specific guidelines for the use, conservation, and control of its natural gas, oil, and electrical energy from among the following: Two Public Members; Two Representatives of Industry; One Representative of the Oil Industry; One Representative of the Natural Gas Industry; One Member from the Electric Utilities Industry; and Two Members from the Providence City Council, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said Commissioners report their findings, along with their recommendations, to His Honor the Mayor within four weeks of the said Commissioners' appointments.
