Approved May 9, 1990

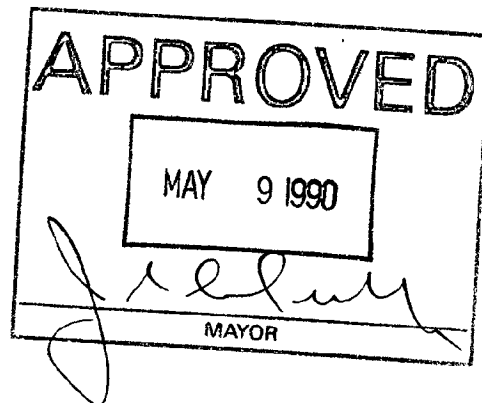
