

WHEREAS, Along Broadway there presently exists traffic signs directing trailer trucks to use alternative routes which has not been enforced,



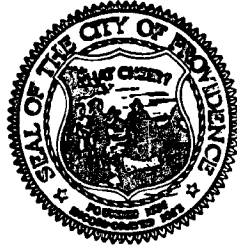
