## A N A C T

RELATING TO CITIES AND TOWNS -- STATE AID

99-H 5021

Introduced By: Representative BarrDate Introduced: January 7, 1999Referred To: Committee on Finance

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 45-13 of the General Laws entitled "State Aid" is hereby amended  
2   by adding thereto the following section:

3           45-13-1.3. Aid reduced because of residency requirements. -- (a) If any city or town  
4   maintains a residency requirement as a condition to employment by that municipality, which  
5   requirement shall be in full force and effect as of July 1, 1999, then there shall be withheld from:  
6   (1) any state aid for education to be determined under the provisions of title 16; and (2) any state  
7   aid determined to be due under the provisions of this chapter, an amount equal to fifty percent  
8   (50%) of such aid that would otherwise be given, until such time as said residency requirement is  
9   no longer in effect.

10          If any city or town maintains such a residency requirement in full force and effect as of  
11   July 1, 2000, then there shall be withheld an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of  
12   such aid that would otherwise be given.

13          (b) In the event a city or town experiences a reduction in state aid and/or education aid  
14   pursuant to the provisions of this section and subsequently repeals and/or removes a residency  
15   requirement, such municipality shall be entitled to receive state aid for that fiscal year in which  
16   the residency requirement is removed an amount equal to the proportionate number of days left  
17   in the state's fiscal year in which the residency requirement is removed.

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## EXPLANATION BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

RELATING TO CITIES AND TOWNS -- STATE AID

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1 This act would penalize any municipality that has a residency rule by withholding 50%  
2 of general state aid and education aid in 1999, and 100% of such aid in 2000.

3 This act would take effect upon passage.
