WHEREAS, Alert witnesses gave a description of the car and registration of the suspects to Police Officers, which was immediately broadcast, followed by numerous officers diligently searching the area, and

WHEREAS, Detectives went to the home and other known establishments in search of the pair, and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Raymond Owens recognizing the car at the Mobil Station on Elmwood Avenue, called for back up, and


