Approved September 26, 1980

RESOLVED, That the Acting Public Service Engineer is requested to order the replacement of the existing street light on Megee Street and the addition of two street lights along the easterly side of said street with the understanding that Brown University will pay for the cost of installation of lighting fixtures similar to the Benefit Street lighting fixtures, such street lights to be rated at 1.5 foot candles for a 50 foot radius.


Dear Bob:

The Preservation Society is very much interested in Brown University's efforts to refurbish the Faculty Club and grounds. We are particularly supportive of the plan to improve the grounds of the Club, in particular to add three of the "Providence Lights" designed for the Society as part of the recently completed \$600,000 College Hill Improvements Project, undertaken in collaboration with the City of Providence.
