WHEREAS, Born in Wadowice, Poland in 1920, Karol Josef Wojtyla was the son of working class parents and at a very young age, Karol submersed himself in the vocation of education. His affinity toward learning became readily apparent by his exceptional grades and his mastering of eight languages. He loved poetry, literature and had a real proclivity toward drama and acting; and

WHEREAS, After high school, he attended Jagiellonian University in Krakow until 1939 when the invading Nazi forces closed the university, causing Karol to become a factory worker until 1942. Studying for the priesthood clandestinely, he was ordained a priest on November 1, 1946 and sent to study in Rome. Within two years of studying in the Papal City, he attained a doctorate degree in philosophy and in 1953, back in Krakow, he attained his second doctorate degree in moral theology; and

WHEREAS, His reputation as a church intellectual grew rapidly and in 1958 he was consecrated Auxiliary Bishop of Krakow; 1964 named Archbishop of Krakow; 1967 elevated to the College of Cardinals and on October 16, 1978 elected Pope of the Roman Catholic Church taking the name Pope John Paul II; and






