We are asking for the speed for automobiles traveling on any street surrounding these project buildings be dropped from (25) twenty five (M.P.H) to (15) fifteen (M.P.H) We would also like signs reading, "Slow children crossing." These streets are, Pavilion Avenue from Rugby Street north along Prairie Avenue to Thubers Avenue, east from Thubers to Rugby Street, and south back to Pavilion Avenue.

We also feel that during school hours, that there should be a woman crossing guard at the corner of Prairie Avenue and Cady Street.

THAT the following Minute on the life and the character of ^{v.} the late D. Everett Whelan, City Clerk of Providence from January 2, 1945 to August 28, 1963, when his death occurred, is hereby adopted, ordered inscribed on the records of this City Council and that a duly certified copy be transmitted to the family of the deceased.

M I N U T E

D. Everett Whelan was born in Jewett City, Connecticut, on May 14, 1898, to Timothy and Margaret (Buckley) Whelan, deceased. In his early youth his family moved to Providence where he received his formal education at public and parochial schools.

"Ev" Whelan's talents were ^{v.} innumerable, although his demeanor was humble. In his private ^{v.} life he set a pattern of behavior that was exemplary. His public life was a code of ethics which should be the rule to follow.

A devote Catholic, Everett, was known as an avid worker for all charities, a trait which reflected in his person. Loyalty was an attribute that he never violated; humility was commonplace with him.

In the passing of D. Everett Whelan, legions of his friends and his associates mourn but will remember his humanity to man. Mere superlatives would be inadequate to describe him, suffice it to state, "He was a gentle-man."
