"4. SIGNS--Any sign which lawfully existed and was maintained at the time this ordinance became effective, may be continued, and/or in the discretion of the Inspector of Buildings, may be enlarged not more than twenty-five per cent, but not in excess of the maximum limits authorized by this ordinance, although such use does not conform with the provisions hereof."

SEC. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, and all ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

"4. SIGNS--Any sign which lawfully existed and was maintained at the time this ordinance became effective, may be continued, and/or in the discretion of the Inspector of Buildings may be enlarged not more than twenty-five per cent, but not in excess of the maximum limits authorized by this ordinance, although such use does not conform with the provisions hereof."



PSYCHIATRIC SOCIAL WORKER

CLASS TITLE: Psychiatric Social Worker

CLASS DEFINITION: Plans and supervises a psychiatric social work program in the psychopathic department of the Charles V. Chapin Hospital, and related work as required.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF WORK: Work involves the responsibility for planning and supervising a psychiatric social work program assuming responsibility for case work methods and procedures. Receives general instructions relative to practices and policies to be pursued from superintendent and specific assignments from the Clinical Director-Psychiatric. Supervises the work of a small staff of case workers.

ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF WORK: Supervises others and participates in psychiatric social case work services in the psychiatric department of the Charles V. Chapin Hospital. Assigns case work schedules or specific cases to subordinates. Reviews the work of subordinates for completeness and compliance with professional case work procedures. Discusses cases with hospital staff and makes recommendations. Interviews relatives, and patients for the purpose of developing case histories; prepares abstracts, summaries, and letters on active and discharged patients. Makes home and community visits. Makes appointments for patients at neuro-psychiatric clinic, takes steps necessary to insure attendance at clinic. Assists in the formulation of plans for the care of parole patients with special emphasis on the use of community resources, and has charge of the supervision of parole cases. Instructs social workers in procedures and techniques. Keeps records of departmental activities. Makes periodic and special reports.

DESIRABLE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Thorough knowledge of the principles, practices and procedures standard in psychiatric social work and skill in their application. Familiarity with the various types of mental diseases. Ability to deal with mental patients. Thorough knowledge of the community resources available to assist in the adjustment of parole cases. Ability to plan and lay out the work of others.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED FOR APPOINTMENT: Graduation from a college of recognized standing supplemented by the completion of graduate courses in psychiatric social work in a school of social work of recognized standing. Considerable experience as a psychiatric social worker in a mental hospital a psychiatric clinic including some experience at the supervisory level.

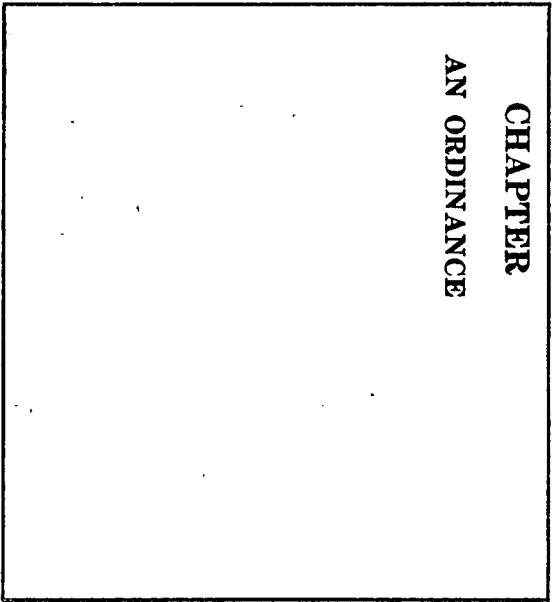

AIR POLLUTION REGULATION ENGINEER

CLASS TITLE: Air Pollution Regulation Engineer

CLASS DEFINITION: Performs responsible supervisory work in the examination of commercial fuel burning heating equipment, or other fuel combustion equipment and issuing installation permits.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF WORK: Under the general direction of the Public Service Engineer, administers and directs the work of air pollution inspectors in a program of smoke abatement. A substantial part of the program is concerned with the inspection of fuel burning installations for conformity with regulations and investigation of smoke **nuisance complaints** & defective installations. Subject to the limitations of state law and city ordinances, prepares rules and regulations for the fulfillment of the intent of the air pollution ordinance, initiating investigations and studies for reducing air pollution and interpreting the results of investigations.

ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF WORK: Plans, assigns and supervises the work of several air pollution inspectors. Examines for approval the application and plans for the construction, installation or alteration of any fuel burning or related equipment. Examines the plans of new buildings or alterations of existing buildings for compliance with rules and regulations relative to air pollution. Prepares and disseminates information concerning methods of smoke and other air pollution reduction. Confers with equipment manufacturers and suppliers, industrial official homeowners and installers, interpreting regulations and discussing remedial measures for fuel burning equipment defects. Addresses civic, fraternal and other civic minded groups interested in smoke abatement and air pollution control.

DESIRABLE KNOWLEDGES, ABILITIES AND SKILLS: Thorough knowledge of the municipal heating code and the Air Pollution Ordinances and related regulations. Thorough knowledge of the materials and methods used in the installation of heating fuel consuming and allied installations including electrical phases of the appliance. Ability to plan, assign and supervise the work of personnel engaged in air pollution regulation. Ability to enforce regulations firmly, tactfully and impartially. Ability to express oneself clearly and concisely, orally and in writing. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with equipment manufacturers, contractors, property owners, installers, industrial officials

and the general public. Ability to conduct and supervise the various tests applicable to work. Skill in the reading and interpretation of installation plans and specifications plans for heating systems, high pressure boilers, fuel consuming and allied installations.

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QUALIFICATIONS NECESSARY FOR APPOINTMENT: Graduation from a recognized college or university with major courses in combustion engineering. Verification as a professional engineer, or shall have had a minimum of five years experience in air pollution control administration.
