SUBJECT: Referral No. 1339 - ZONING CHANGE AT 812 BRANCH AVENUE

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, September 3, 1963.

This referral is a request for study and report on a petition to change from R-3 to M-1 the zoning of Lot 59 as set out and delineated on City Assessor's Plat 102; said lot being designated 812 Branch Avenue.

An inspection and photographic survey determined the area in question contained 261,537 square feet of land area in an R-3 Zone, occupied by a one-story masonry industrial building.

Reference is made to several petitions to the City Council and the Zoning Board of Review concerning the property in question and reference is also made to a letter from the Director of the City Plan Commission to Mayor Walter H. Reynolds dated July 22, 1963. This letter reviews the aforementioned petitions and mentions the rezoning in 1959 from R-2 and R-3 to M-1 the Wanskuck Pond, across Branch Avenue from the property in question. To quote from the last paragraph of this letter: "All in all this area of well kept homes has had far more than its share of incompatible use encroachment and strong positive efforts should be made to prevent the area from further downgrading, which surely would occur from the creation of more industrial zoning in the vicinity."
