Annual report from the Providence Board of Canvassers for the year January 1, 1982 through December 31, 1982.

1. New registrations taken in 1982	=	12,133
2. Transfers from other districts	=	1,864
3. Transfers to other districts	=	1,864
4. Voters removed because of deaths	=	1,100
5. Voters moved out of City and/or no vote 5 yrs.	=	9,929
6. Eligible vote January 1, 1982	=	88,205
7. Eligible vote December 31, 1982	=	89,309


1982 was another extremely busy year for the Board of Canvassers. Included in the approximately 27,000 additions, deletions and corrections as listed above, 8,213 voters were removed for no vote in five years.

The month of March included conducting the special election in the fifth ward for City Council and beginning the re-apportionment process following the re-drawing of Ward, House and Senate lines as well as Congressional district lines. After several months of planning, drawing of lines and placement of eligible voters, the staff was ready in July for the massive job of re-apportioning some 90,000 registration cards into their proper districts and proper binders.

All was completed in time for the September primary and the November general election, except for the Senate elections which were postponed following much litigation in the State and Federal Courts.

The September primaries and November elections saw a record number of nearly 13,000 mail ballot applications processed and some 12,000 new registrations recorded.


