No. 135 AN ORDINANCE

AMENDING CHAPTER 761, SECTIONS 15 and 51

OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE APPROVED AUGUST 7, 1953.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1: Chapter 761 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence approved August 7, 1953, as amended is hereby further amended as follows:

Resolved,

That his Honor the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute an agreement between the City of Providence and the City of Cranston relative to a strip of land at the southerly end of the former Walsh-Kaiser shipyard so-called, in the City of Cranston, extending from Narragansett Boulevard easterly to the Cranston-Providence City line, dedicated for highway purposes by an agreement between the City of Providence and the War Assets Administration of the United States of America, in accordance with the provisions of a stipulation filed in the condemnation proceeding in the District Court of the United States for the District of Rhode Island, entitled "United States of America, Petitioner vs. Certain Lands in the City of Providence and the City of Cranston, Rhode Island, Walter A. Watts et al., Defendants, Misc. No. 155", by the terms of which agreement the City of Providence will convey to the City of Cranston that portion of a strip of land, 60 ft. in width, within the City of Cranston, extending easterly from the center line of Palace Street (as said Palace Street existed previous to the land condemnation in the proceeding hereinabove mentioned) subject to all the covenants, conditions and limitations contained in an agreement between the City of Providence and the United States of America, aforesaid; and the City of Providence further agrees to bear approximately one half of the cost of the construction of the highway on condition that the City of Cranston bear the other half of the cost thereof.

For the purpose of carrying out the terms of this agreement the Director of Public Works of the City of Providence is hereby authorized to pay for one half the cost of the highway not to exceed \$25,000, the same to be charged to highway account #2.
