Mrs. Rose Antonelli has been a Human Relations Specialist here at Mount Pleasant High School for twenty years. In this capacity, she has done an excellent job.


Rose not only listens to the students' problems, she very carefully follows-up with telephone calls to the home when she feels the situation warrants it.

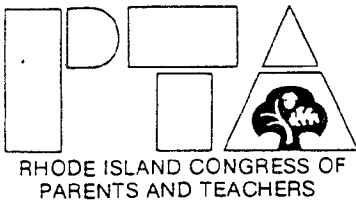

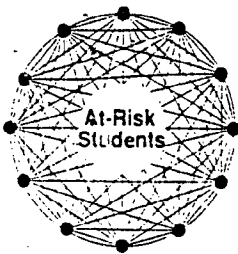
The PTA has always held children as its' only concern. When public policy puts the needs of children first, it will begin to restore to our children that which will eventually empower all of us for the future we need.
