

Dear Mr. Clement:

I am in receipt of Resolution 544 approved by the City Council on September 9, 1994 which reads as follows: "RESOLVED, That the Plaque for Lieutenant Vincent B. Coleman which appeared at the Hendrick Street School which was demolished, be replaced."

I asked a member of my staff to do some research and found that the Hendrick Street School was closed on March 1, 1943. Further investigation led to the fact that the plaque was posted on a pole quite near the Hendrick Street School which was also taken down.

Since my office does not have jurisdiction over the demolition of buildings and other City property, nor do I have any information about Lt. Coleman except that the plaque was erected in his honor after he was named missing in action during World War II, I am unable to assist you in this matter.
