A challenging and responsible position with a progressive environment in which extensive experience, personal skills, and commitment to education and professional growth will be utilized to their fullest potential and in which continued personal and professional growth will be encouraged. Eventually, I would like to become a superintendent of schools.

Work History

July 1992-Present - Principal of Central High School, Providence, RI. Responsible for the day to day operations and leadership of Rhode Island's largest comprehensive high school. Duties include the planning, organizing, staffing, coordinating, directing, reporting, budgeting, monitoring, evaluating, and implementation of all programs, staff, services and departments at Central High School as well as indirect monitoring and overseeing of the school's Area Vocational Technical Center (Hanley).

April 1990 - July 1992 - Principal/Director of Hanley Vocational Technical Center at Central High School. Duties included overseeing the day to day operation of the Vocational center. Responsible for directing, supervising and evaluating staff activities, programs and services, program development, program administration, budget coordination with industry, the Rhode Island Department of Education and other Vocational Center Directors. Grant writing to obtain federal funds was an integral part of my responsibilities.

August 1984-April 1990 - Principal/Director of the Woonsocket Area Vocational Technical Skills Center. Responsible for working directly under the superintendent of schools and having the administrative responsibility for providing students enrolled in the Woonsocket Area Vocational-Technical Facility with education and training of sufficient excellence to enable them upon graduation to enter the job market with well-developed skills and varied intellectual interests. Duties included enforcing school policies, developing, monitoring and evaluating vocational programs and services, grantwriting to bring federal money into Woonsocket, preparing budgets, serving on various committees, directing the public relations program, supervising personnel.

December 1979-August 1984 - Assistant Principal in charge of Alternate Programs at the William M. Davies Vocational Technical School in Lincoln, RI. This was the state's only full time, state owned and state operated comprehensive academic and vocational school in Rhode Island. Responsible for assisting the Principal in the day to day management and supervision of the school in accordance with the policies, laws, and Regulations Governing the Operation and Management of Area Vocational Technical Centers in Rhode Island. Duties include federal grant writing to obtain funds to operate alternate school programs for youths and adults such as: CETA and ITA Programs; Summer and Evening Programs; Second Technical Day; Dropout Prevention, Limited English Proficient, Vocational Programs and Services for Handicapped Youths; Vocational Training for Adults.
