In complying with the ordinances of the City of Providence, the Board of Park Commissioners present the following report of the North Burial Ground for the year 1972.

During the year 1972 the sum of \$5,145.25 was received for Perpetual Care of Lots and Single Graves.

During the year 1972 there were 367 interments making a total of 65,132 since 1848, that being the first year that records of interments were kept.

115 foundations for headstones or monuments were built.

There were 46 Lots placed under Perpetual Care and 77 Single Graves placed under Perpetual Care.

The present number of lots under Annual Care, 10.

Number of Lots now held in Perpetual Trust, 317.

The average number of employees during the year was 13.

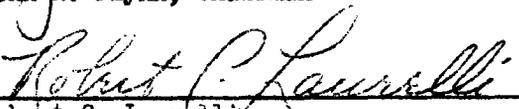

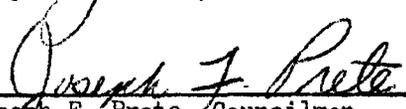
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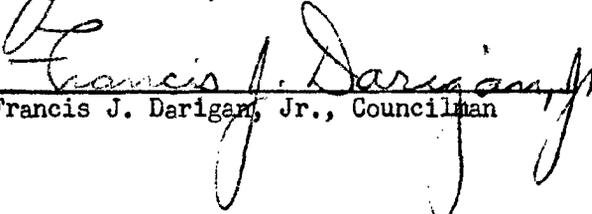
