The following requests from your Committee have been taken under advisement and we offer the following dispositions:

- (1) Courtland Street and Grove Street - installation of a four way stop control.

Disposition: Denied. This intersection does not meet the warrants for a four way stop control. Please see copy of previous memorandum concerning four-way stop controls.

- (2) Nelson Street - Nelson Street, between Smith Street and Eaton Street, to be closed during school dismissal and arrival hours.

Disposition: Granted. This department offers no objection to the closing of Nelson Street during school arrival and dismissal.

- (3) Gentian Avenue and Isabella Avenue - installation of a four way stop control.

Disposition: Granted. A four-way stop control was installed on 8/26/88.

- (4) Gentian Avenue and Wanskuck Avenue - installation of a four way stop control.

Disposition: Denied. This intersection does not meet the warrants for a four way stop control. Please see copy of previous memorandum concerning four-way stop controls.

- (5) Maynard Street and Rushmore Avenue - installation of a four-way stop control.

Disposition: Denied. This intersection does not meet the warrants for a four way stop control. Please see copy of previous memorandum concerning four way Stop controls. The intersection of Maynard Street and Sission Street has been changed to a four-way STOP control.

- (6) Courtland Street and Ring Street - installation of a four-way Stop control.

Disposition: Denied. This intersection does not meet the warrants for a four-way stop control. Please see copy of previous memorandum concerning four way stop controls.

- (7) ✓ Congress Avenue and Melrose Street - installation of a four way stop control.

Disposition: Intersection is presently under study and the results will be presented at the next scheduled meeting of the Public Works Committee.

- (8) Ivy Street, Dana Street and Rochambeau Avenue - installation of a three-way stop control.

Disposition: Denied. This intersection does not meet the warrants for a three way stop control. This intersection does not meet the warrants for an all-way stop control. Please see copy of previous memorandum concerning four-way stop controls.

- (9) Williams Street and Thayer Street - installation of a four-way stop control.

Disposition: Intersection is presently under study and the results will be presented at the next scheduled meeting of the Public Works Committee.

- (10) Dana Street, between Ivy Street and Camp Street, establishment of a one way street in a westerly direction.

Disposition: This department offers no objection to making Dana Street one way.

- (11) Junction Street, between Bridgham Street and Arch Street, establishment of a one way street.

Disposition; This department offers no objection to making Junction Street one way.




WHEREAS, Because of this condition, it has become apparent that the safety of the children is of great concern, and
